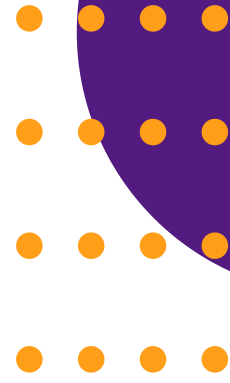

Project Summary



The Toy Foundation's Children's Hospital Play Fund is the only industry-wide funding initiative that brings the power of play to children's hospitals.

Play provides comfort, fulfills emotional needs, and incentivizes pediatric patients during their medical journeys. In order to provide, children's hospitals are reliant on external funding or donations.

Thanks to the toy industry's collective support, in 2024 **245,000 children in need undergoing medical treatment** had access to the powerful benefits of play through the funding 20 unique play projects at children's hospitals that serve under-resourced communities nationwide. Since the program's launch in 2021, it has provided play to more than 500,000 children.

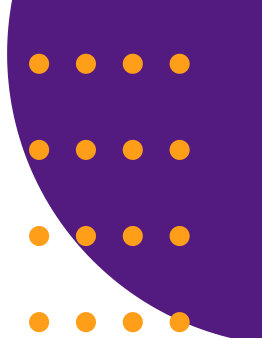
